Women play a crucial role in agritourism development, capitalizing on consumer demand and opportunities for entrepreneurship. Despite women often initiating agritourism, they earn less than male counterparts likely due to women's distinctive motivations and expectations as agripreneurs as well as unique challenges of the United States agricultural context that hinder their success. The NC Women in Agritourism research-extension project strengthens women's chances of success in agritourism by identifying their needs and opportunities on the ground and helping them achieve entrepreneurial success. The outreach has sparked cross state collaboration and increased engagement in agritourism across North Carolina State Extension.

As competitive grant funding has increasingly become a key revenue source for community initiatives, a new Purdue Extension team fully revamped the Beginner's Guide to Grant Writing (BGGW) program to meet emerging needs. The team of educators across program areas came together to assess the need, rewrite the curriculum, restructure the delivery model and re-launch the program. The team achieved successful results through dedication to the project, shared responsibility and creative problem-solving. In its first year, participants of the program received \$900,000 in grant funding after attending the 2016-2017 workshops.

In addition to a pdf, the team created an interactive online version of the annual highlights through the ESRI Story Map application. The online version features text, photos, charts, live links and an interactive map to tell the story. While there were only 49 views of the static web page/pdf from April-December 2017, there were 137 views of the online story map. Incorporating the new, interactive online technology has increased awareness of Ohio State Extension's accomplishments and encouraged more people to engage in the highlights of the teams' important work.

After working with several communities in need of educational and technical assistance in reclaiming parks due to real and perceived safety issues, Dr. Jamie Rae Walker adapted the National Institute of Crime Prevention's "Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design" training program to address park concerns. Beginning in 2017, Texas A&M AgriLife Extension started offering affordable and time sensitive CEU trainings, assessment and planning workshops and technical assistance for Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design in Parks. Dr. Walker has trained more than 300 practitioners and aided four major park departments in adapting operations and maintenance practices to improve safety in their parks.
