## NACDEP Diversity Award: Individual and Team

This award recognizes outstanding efforts and accomplishments in achieving and sustaining diversity in the extension organization, community development programs, and audiences.

#### Individual Winner:

Self-Directing Washington State University Tribal Extension Daniel L. Fagerlie – Washington State University Extension

Dan Fagerlie utilized Extension Community Development resources and principles to assess needs, secure funding, develop and deliver multiple Extension projects to the region's low income and Native American residents. In 2014, his work reached over 10,000 otherwise underserved individuals. Under his stewardship, the branch office he established on the Colville Reservation grew to be the first "Self-Directing" Washington State University Tribal Extension office in the state this past year and serves as a model for others across the nation.

In March 2014, a landslide devastated the small communities near Oso, Washington. As emergency response efforts evolved into recovery, Washington State University Extension faculty, staff, students, and partners created a team to help affected persons rebuild their lives and communities. The Team helped procure over \$462K in grants and donations for recovery efforts. Citizens and elected officials became more aware of the resources and expertise available through Extension; the University's involvement had positive, measurable, and lasting effects on the area.

## NACDEP Educational Technology Awards: Individual and Team

This award recognizes NACDEP members for the use of technology in delivering or managing educational programs, in expanding the use of technology in community development work, and/or the use of educational technology to promote logical, problem-solving techniques.

*Virtual Field Trip for Teton Valley* Mary Martin – University of Wyoming Extension

Since 2013, hundreds of community members in the Teton Valley have benefited from the "Virtual Field Trip" created through the leadership of Mary Martin. This video series allows community members a "front-row seat" to the complex issues facing the Teton Valley. Using technology to educate constituents and support the public input process, this Virtual Field Trip is helping to engage people, and honoring their right to be informed and involved in their future.

The Montana State University Local Government Database Project is an interactive online tool for citizens and public officials providing demographic, fiscal and structural characteristics of each unit of local government in Montana. This new web-based system allows for increased accessibility of government data, thereby increasing transparency, trust, and ultimately the ability of individuals to learn about their communities to better address complex issues associated with local governance.

#### Bee Inspired Gardens Roslynn Brain – Utah State University Extension

In 2014, Utah State University Extension Sustainability collaborated with a diverse group of community partners to design and implement a network of water-wise, pollinator-friendly, perennial, edible gardens. The Moab "Bee Inspired Gardens" inspire both locals and visitors, and demonstrate the importance of pollinator health, community food systems, water conservation, and an economy that benefits people and our ecology.

*From an Armory to a Business Incubator* Kathryn Friday and Brenda Tuck – Alabama Cooperative Extension Service

The closing of the Linden Armory could have been just another blow to a small town and the loss of jobs, but Kathryn Friday and Brenda Tuck had other ideas. Working with the Marengo County Commission, the Economic Development Authority and local businesses, the armory was transformed into a business incubator. The center has been a success for local small businesses and the community: The space already houses three businesses and 25 employees, and more than 2,200 individuals, including 4-H youth, local farmers, and law enforcement have attended programs conducted at the facility.

## NACDEP Cross-Program Award: Individual and Team

#### On-Farm Solar Energy Development

As solar electric systems have become more economical, a growing number of Ohio farmers are considering on-farm solar electric systems. In response to this growing trend, a multidisciplinary team of Ohio State University Extension Educators collaborated to develop a new curriculum to provide farmers knowledge and best practices for on-farm solar energy applications in Ohio. The team combined the expertise in energy education from community development educators with the needs of farm energy applications and trends from the agriculture and natural resource educators. In 2014, the team delivered the new On-Farm Solar Energy program 15 times throughout Ohio, reaching 600 participants.

## NACDEP Educational Materials Awards: Individual and Team

The Flooding in Iowa Outreach Project includes 21 short webbased videos with supporting participant materials, a 60-page Desk Reference, a FAQ section, and links to other important resources all designed for an audience with no prior experience in law, hydrology, or the National Flood Insurance Program. Developed in consultation with the Iowa Department of Natural Resources, the program educates community officials and the general public about floodplains, flood risks, and basic floodplain management.

One of these creative spaces is in Charleston, W.Va., where a growing number of co-workers, innovators, startups and generally curious people hang out. Part talent hub, part business incubator, part new-media-new-business think-tank, the DigiSo (digital and social) space provides businesses, youth, makers, and citizen scientists a place to engage, learn, collaborate, and innovate.

## NACDEP Distinguished National Service Award
